Alun and Joy Jones Awards 2008 "Amazing spaces of Chislehurst"



Babington House School takes top award for second year

The Alun and Joy Jones Awards for Environmental Studies competition reached its climax at Babington House on 5th June, when prizes of more than £1,600 were given by the Chislehurst Society to schools and individual students.

The subject this year was Amazing Spaces of Chislehurst. Students from schools in and around Chislehurst were invited to submit entries which explored the inside and outside perspectives of their favourite spaces.

More than 400 excited students parents and teachers attended the ceremony at Babington House School, where 102 certificates and 38 cash prizes were handed over to successful entrants. "This is one of the most important events which the Society runs" said Tony Allen, the Chairman of the Chislehurst Society, "and certainly the most enjoyable."

Donna Bompas, who organised the event, and led the panel of eight judges, told the audience that the Awards provided a wonderful opportunity for students to take a step back to observe and study their local environment, and as a result to gain a better understanding of the community around them. This years' event, the 18th, was launched in January at a party at Pizza Express on Royal Parade, and led to over 250 submissions to the judging panel.

Student from Farringtons wins top individual prize

For the second year in a row, Babington House School took the Alun Jones Memorial Trophy (shown above with celebrating students from the school). The Trophy is awarded to the School submitting the most outstanding entries.

The overall individual winner, and recipient of the Joy Jones Award, was Ching Hang Wah, Olivia from Farringtons School, for her two A level entries, - a painting of Ferens Hall and a terracotta sculpture of Chislehurst Perspectives (shown right).

Gill Goldsmith was a well-loved teacher at Red Hill School for 23 years. The School designed and made a tiled mural at the school to celebrate her life. The tiles depict scenes from Chislehurst and are on display at the school. The Society gave a special award to the school for this entry.

Mead Road School won first place for Infants for their model of the school and its grounds (pictured overleaf) on which all the students worked, while Marjorie McClure School took second place in the intermediates for their entry "Design and make a model", which required students to design and plan for the effective implementation of work areas suitable for their school and students

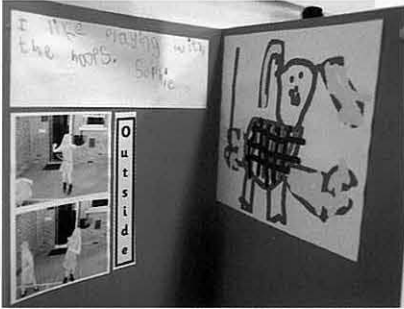

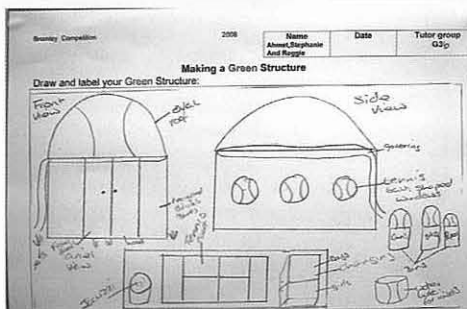


Our Amazing Space

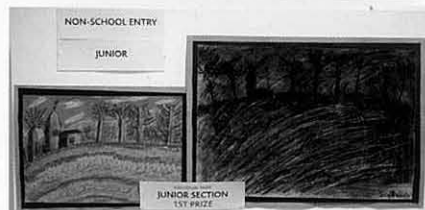
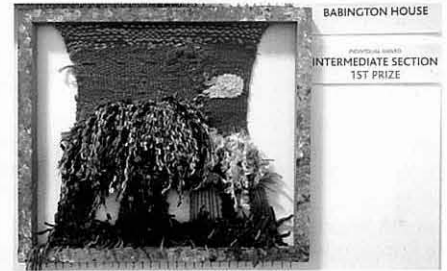

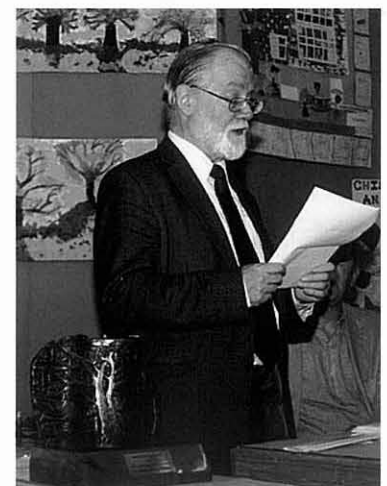
It's part of your future - Look after it well.

Roy Hopper (pictured, right) was head librarian at Chislehurst Library for many years, and has huge knowledge of Chislehurst past and present. Roy was on the panel of judges for the Awards this year, as he has been in most years. He gave a most interesting talk to students, parents and teachers at the Awards Ceremony about amazing spaces in Chislehurst. Here are some extracts:

One of the entries I really liked this year was the geological model of Chislehurst. I don't ever recall seeing anything quite like it before. It conveyed a sense of the amazingly vast spaces of geological time locked away in the rocks and of course the Chislehurst caves which are man-made spaces of a really amazing nature.

An advantage of this year's theme was that it gave you an opportunity to really explore Chislehurst – including Scadbury Park, the open spaces of Hawkwood and the woodland of Petts Wood. Your predecessors in the 19th Century had to fight to keep the Commons from being spoiled, to struggle in the 1920s to prevent the Petts Woods woodlands being built on, and to object to development of Scadbury Park, so that it exists as it is now. All three of these public spaces you enjoy had to be fought for by local people who cared about what Chislehurst was going to look like in the future. If you get a chance, wander through these amazing spaces and think for a moment about the people who knew and loved them as children and grew up to save them for us today.

I think your love of Chislehurst showed up very well this year. Continue to look after it as you grow older, and go on caring for it, or for whatever landscape in which you find yourself in the years to come. How well it survives depends upon how much you care about its history, its appearance and how you treat it. It's going to be part of your future. Look after it well.
